SPECIFIC RISK FACTORS

• **FOREIGN EXCHANGE MARKET RISKS** - Restrictions imposed on trading limits or restrictions on the amount by which the price of certain Foreign Exchange rates may vary during a given time period, the volume which may be traded, or restrictions or penalties for carrying positions in certain foreign currencies over time may prevent trades from being executed during a given trading period. Such restrictions or limits could prevent the Investment Manager from promptly liquidating unfavourable positions and therefore could subject the Fund to substantial losses.

• **VOLATILITY RISK** - The Integra Absolute Forex Fund is an aggressive fund and as such subject to relatively high levels of volatility.

• **OTHER RISKS** - Investors are to refer to the 'General Risk Factors' section in Offering Supplement. Professional Investor Funds are Non-Retail schemes. Therefore, the protection normally arising as a result of the imposition of the MFSA's investment and borrowing restrictions and other requirements for retail schemes do not apply for this fund. Investors in PIFs are not protected by any statutory compensation arrangements in the event of the fund's failure. INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND POLICIES

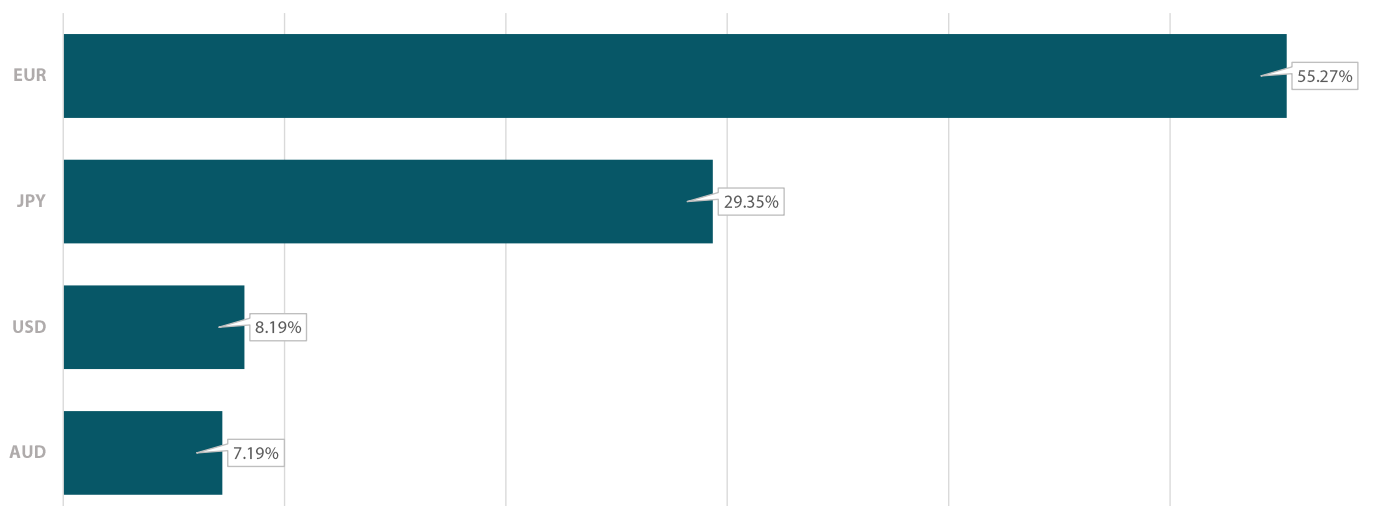
The Fund's overall investment objective is to maximise absolute returns over the medium to long term (which should be considered a period of between 3 and 10 years) and achieve substantial capital appreciation. The Fund will aim to achieve this result by investing primarily in the Foreign Exchange and the Commodities Markets. The Fund makes extensive use of derivatives to reduce various risks for efficient portfolio management and as a way to gain exposure (long or short) to multiple assets, markets or other investment opportunities (including derivatives that focus on foreign exchange).

The portfolio manager uses economic research and a combination of fundamental, technical and quantitative models on a 12-month horizon to identify investment opportunities in the foreign exchange and commodities market. The manager constructs a highly diversified portfolio using a wide range of currency exposure and implementing strategic and tactical positions, including arbitrage among credit, interest rate and currency markets.

DESCRIPTION OF UNDERLYING POSITIONS

• CALL OPTIONS

A call is an option contract giving the owner the right, but not the obligation, to buy a specified amount of an underlying security at a specified price within a specified time. The specified price is known as the strike price and the specified time during which a sale is made is its expiration or time to maturity. You pay a fee to purchase a call option, called the premium; this per-share charge is the maximum you can lose on a call option. Call options may be purchased for speculation or sold for income purposes or for tax management. Call options may also be combined for use in spread or combination strategies.

• PUT OPTIONS

Put options give holders of the option the right, but not the obligation, to sell a specified amount of an underlying security at a specified price within a specified time frame. Put options are available on a wide range of assets, including stocks, indexes, commodities, and currencies. Put option prices are impacted by changes in the price of the underlying asset, the option strike price, time decay, interest rates, and volatility. Put options increase in value as the underlying asset falls in price, as volatility of the underlying asset price increases, and as interest rates decline. Put options lose value as the underlying asset increases in price, as volatility of the underlying asset price decreases, as interest rates rise, and as the time to expiration nears.

• FX FORWARDS

Currency forwards are OTC contracts traded in forex markets that lock in an exchange rate for a currency pair. They are generally used for hedging, and can have customized terms, such as a particular notional amount or delivery period. Unlike listed currency futures and options contracts, currency forwards don't require up-front payments when used by large corporations and banks. Determining a currency forward rate depends on interest rate differentials for the currency pair in question.

• FUTURES

Futures are derivative financial contracts that obligate parties to buy or sell an asset at a predetermined future date and price. The buyer must purchase or the seller must sell the underlying asset at the set price, regardless of the current market price at the expiration date.

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
